Biographical Sketch

I am a Geriatric Psychiatrist, mother of 4 beautiful and healthy children and grandmother of four! My parents lived independently until they were 94 and 93. (I will always treasure them as a passport to a healthy ageing!).

I have been working in the field, of Geriatric Psychiatry for almost 30 years and I was the first person to train in this field in my country, the Dominican Republic.

After finishing my training as a General Psychiatrist, and then acquiring added qualifications in Geriatric Psychiatry in The United States, I took both board exams (General and Geriatric Psychiatry), obtaining approved certification in both. Once I finished, I held several positions in different institutions and community's mental health centres. in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. I worked very close to the school system of Allegheny County, while holding a staff position at Butler Community Mental health Centre, for which I had to testified on behave of children that had been physically or emotionally abused. Later on, for this work, I was invited to join the American College of Forensic Medicine, and was certified by its board.

In 1987, I came back to The Dominican Republic, my country of origin, and established my private practice in geriatric psychiatry, today Is the largest practice in this area in this country.

Since then, I have dedicated my life to the study and treatment of AD and other dementias, to the point that my colleagues and students call me "Lady Alzheimer".

I am very actively involved with our Geriatric and psychiatry associations and held the position of vice chair several times, of our national psychiatry association, and of The Dominican College of

Neuropsychopharmacology, this has helped a lot in maintaining a good relationship between our Alzheimer's Association, (Asociacion Dominicana de Alzheimer) that I co-founded, and the professionals of other areas. I teach on the subject of Geriatrics at Universidad Nacional Pedro Henriquez Ureña, UNPHU), where I am in charge and have coordinated this area for the last 17 years and at the present coordinate group #4 of the curricular change taking place at the University in our medical school.

I am a lecturer specifically on the subject of ageing and dementia in different universities, clubs, retirement's homes and others as well as around the world. Have organized many successful national and international medical congresses as well.

To serve the community in the mental health area I joined the group of "Catholic Psychiatrists holding a secretarial job in this group which aims are, to educate about mental illnesses and to provide home and treatment to the homeless mentally ill.

Research is badly needed to change health policies, reason why I got involved in The 10/66 Dementia Research Group. I am the PI of our centre. We have been working together since 1998 and to date we have published more than 100 scientific papers.

I have been involved with Alzheimer's Disease International since 1994, held many positions, until I became its chairperson 2008-2012. Today I hold the title of Honorary Vice-president of ADI, which is a lifetime honor. I was invited to be a member of the World Dementia Council, representing the developing world, until January 2016.

In 2019 I formed a Brain Biobank at our University with the aim to build a Neuroscience Institute to contribute to research in neurodegenerative diseases around the world. Today we have 14 brain donations which is a big accomplishment in a country like this.
